- 6. The applicant must not be a recipient of another scholarship offering full financial support.
- 7. The applicant must possess a 3.0 or better overall GPA.
- 8. The applicant must have a record of participation in extra-curricular activities and community service.
- 9. The recipient must not be a member of the Steve Westby family or family member of any Director of the Blue & Gold Foundation

STEVE WESTBY SCHOLARSHIP BIOGRAPHY OF STEVE WESTBY & ESSAY QUESTION

Steven Allen Westby was born in Janesville, Wisconsin, in 1954. As a high school student, he worked on the yearbook staff and he was a standout tennis player. He attended Vanderbilt University and Emory University School of Law. Steve and his wife, Sue, raised four children in Atlanta, Georgia, where he worked as an attorney and founded his own law firm. He enjoyed coaching at Murphy Candler Little League and served several years as president of the organization. All four of his children—Lucas, Elizabeth, Ruth and Paul attended and graduated from Chamblee High School during the years of 1995-2008. At Chamblee High School, he served as Governance Council Chair, Mock Trial Coach, Constitutional Law Adviser for the "We the People" team, Blue & Gold Foundation Director, and fall baseball coach. Most importantly, he was a friend and mentor to many students.

In his work and his community, Steve Westby brought out the best in the people around him. When he died from pancreatic cancer at the age of 55, the Blue & Gold Foundation Board of Directors, composed of CHS Faculty (active and retired), parents, alumni, and community supporters, honored him by creating this scholarship. It is to be awarded to the graduating senior who demonstrates the qualities of leadership, integrity, service and school spirit.
